Habitat is focusing efforts on increasing the number of owner-occupied homes in the historic Lincoln Neighborhood. This Spring, three new homes were completed at 7th and Tippecanoe - along with The House the Schools Built on 8th Street, that's four new homes in the last 18 months. Habitat has plans for another new construction on 7th Street in 2026. Habitat also has two former rental properties that will be rehabilitated and sold to eligible partner families. By the end of 2026, seven new families will own homes in the neighborhood. The location is ideal with easy access to Downtown, the West Side, or Tippecanoe County as a whole. And walking distance to Budgee's - a neighborhood staple - makes the area even sweeter.

Right next door, Jasmine and her crew - daughters Janeal, Faith, and Emma, and son Judah - are counting down the days until they can move into their new digs. Jasmine's been through some tough times, but she's rocking a job she loves at Creasy Springs now and can't wait to give her family the stability of an affordable home. It's pretty amazing to see these families' dreams coming true, and it's all thanks to the incredible women putting in the hard work to make it happen. The 2025 Women Build is set to wrap up this fall, and it's going to be a wonderful celebration when these families finally get to turn the keys and step into their new homes.




